MASHAL-E-ILM IN VILLAGE CHAPRI

In 2022, OGDC launched Mashal-e-Ilm near the Dakhni oil field to bring out-of-school children back into education. Since then, 160 children have been enrolled, overcoming socioeconomic barriers through structured learning and strong community support. A major milestone was reached this year when four students appeared for matriculation exams—all passed, with Fiza topping at 75%. OGDC MOBILE HEALTH UNITS SERVE 8,000+

OGDC's Mobile Health Units provided critical care to underserved communities across Multan, Sukkur, Kohat, and Hyderabad during August 2025. Through 105 medical camps, the initiative benefited 8,087 people, offering OPD consultations, psychosocial support, health awareness sessions, and free medicines. The program also emphasized preventive healthcare with hygiene and disease-prevention education, ensuring access to essential services for vulnerable populations.
